



The 10 Commandments

Share the story of the 10 Commandments and then challenge your young people to come up with their own rules for Boys' Brigade.

How?

First of all, tell your young people the story of the Ten Commandments. You can either do this by reading from the bible, telling your own story or showing a video. A good YouTube video can be found here:

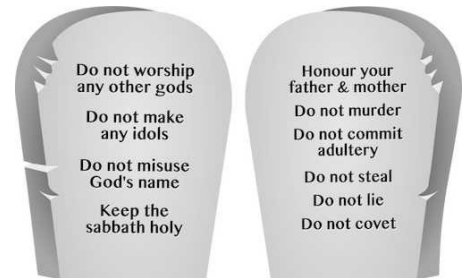
Once you have told the story ask your group a few questions:

- Why are rules important?
- What would the world be like without rules?
- What happens when we don't follow rules?
- Do rules help us to live our lives?

Finish your devotion period by getting your young people to create their own ten commandments for Boys' Brigade. These can then be placed on your notice board and help with managing behaviour at BB. As an example, here are the 10 commandments for the 11th Northampton Juniors.

| 1) Have fun | 6) Don't talk over others |
| 2) Be friendly | 7) Don't be nasty or rude |
| 3) Do our best | 8) Work with my team |
| 4) Show the right attitude | 9) Be polite |
| 5) Help others | 10) Put my hand up to ask questions |

Finish the session by writing down your new rules onto the scroll, to put up on your notice board. Finally pray as a group for the strength to follow your new BB 10 commandments.
